

Oracle PL/SQL

For Oracle, PL/SQL is supported in a BEGIN-SQL paragraph. This requires an additional semicolon at the end of each PL/SQL statement. See the following Oracle example. For more information concerning the different ways to utilize PL/SQL, refer to the Oracle-Library document.

For Oracle PL/SQL: (To run an PL/SQL block in SQR)

```
begin-sql
declare
  varpl varchar2 (25);
  var2 number (8,2);
begin
varpl :='abcdefg';
$v1 :=varpl;
$v2 :='1230894asd';
var2 :=1234.56;
#v :=var2;
end;;
end-sql
```

For Oracle stored procedures: (To call a procedure & receive a value back into an sqr Variable)

```
begin-sql
begin
#dept_number :=get_dept_no($dept_name);
end;;
end-sql
```
